Eric Hanushek is the Paul and Jean Hanna Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institution of Stanford University and a member of the Institution's Koret Task Force on K-12 Education.

This K-12 Education Task Force focuses on education policy as it relates to government provision and oversight versus private solutions (both within and outside the public school system) that stress choice, accountability, and transparency; that include systematic reform options such as vouchers, charter schools, and testing; and that weigh equity concerns against outcome objectives. Its collaborative efforts spawned a quarterly journal titled *Education Next*, one of the premier publications on public education research policy in the nation. Eric Hanushek is best known for introducing rigorous economic analysis into educational policy deliberations. He has produced some fifteen books and over 200 scholarly articles. He is chairman of the Executive Committee for the Texas Schools Project at the University of Texas at Dallas and a research associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research. He currently serves as chair of the Board of Directors of the National Board for Education Sciences. His newest book, *Schoolhouses, Courthouses, and Statehouses: Solving the Funding-Achievement Puzzle in America's Public Schools*, describes how improved school finance policies can be used to meet our achievement goals.

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
